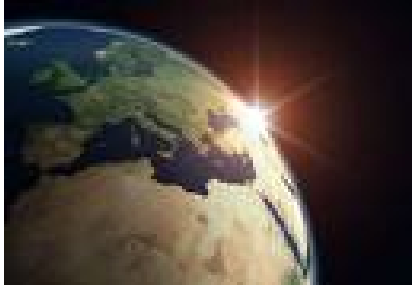

**PRAY TOGETHER!**

Pray through the following list::

(allow time to pray aloud and/or silently for specific people)
